


26th SUNDAY in ORDINARY TIME

Gospel: Luke 16:19-31

This Gospel centers on the reversal of fortunes that takes

place after Lazarus and the rich man die. It links agony or comfort after death with how we treat the less fortunate around us. This reversal after death is ultimate. An unbridgeable gap exists between Lazarus at Abraham's side and the rich man in Hades. God's eternal judgment has everything to do with how we use wealth in this life and

whether we attend to those less fortunate in our midst. Our temptation is to explain away a story like this and to remove its obvious depiction of how God will ultimately vindicate the cause of the poor. But the message has been clearly stated. Like the rich man's five brothers, we have been given all the warning we need.

Can you help me be a better person?

I want to find a safe place to belong?

I wonder where is God?

There we can help you start beginning to answer questions about these matters. No religious affiliation is required. This is the beginning of OCIA (formerly called RCIA), Order of Christian Initiation of Adults. It can include those unbaptized adults or inactive baptized adults from another denomination or baptized Catholics who haven't been active since childhood. This first part is inquiry.
